#### Organizational Impact Sampling & Program Highlights (least to most recent)

Reported \$10 Million for hurricane Katrina/Rita relief by inspiring and unifying nearly 4000 school districts, bringing immediate emergency assistance to tens of thousands of survivors through various relief agencies. Called *TLC*, the project created a youth voice so powerful that ABC National News reported that American school children, rallied through RandomKid, ranked in their relief response with top the five U.S. corporate donors.

Through the RandomKid Water Project, 6000 students were joined together to help 15,000+ people gain access to clean, safe water on four continents. RandomKid connected students from eleven states to brand and market their own private labeled products with proceeds designated for purchase of appropriate and sustainable water pumping technologies, chosen by students. This project continues today.

In a project called *For Each Other*, youth were recruited from twenty countries and all fifty states, raising funds for AIDS and to build and name a school in Cambodia for 200 students.

Created the *Task Force to Rebuild the Gulf*, consisting of ten youth from across the USA who raised \$55,000 and engaged children in every state, as well as numerous governors and state leaders.

RandomKid provided seed money to fund the manufacturing of a product the team designed that has been sold in 445 stores in 13 states. Proceeds funded a Habitat home in the post-Katrina gulf,

refurbished a school, and provided landscaping.

Kicked off the *RandomKid Anti-Bottle* project, selling more than 30,000 reusable water bottles (BPA free) to reduce oil dependency and our carbon footprint. Funds raised to date exceed \$300,000, and are being used to provide safe water in the world, plant organic gardens, and place water filling stations in schools. Youth from 33 states and 3 countries involved.

Developed *Great Strides*— a partnership with the U of IA to help children with Club Foot get the interventions needed in order to be able to walk. Launched in three schools so far, where students are walking so that others can. Forty-one kids have had their Club Foot corrected to date while USA youth gain fitness.

Launched *Slushies that Soothe*, a program where youth design collectible zipper pulls to sell at school that express their values (honesty, caring, generosity, etc.), and proceeds go to placing ICEE machines in pediatric cancer wards to soothe mouths after chemotherapy, exhibiting these values. To date, two machines have been placed, going on a third.

Instigated the pilot *Three Steps Up*, a non-monetary donor program where community leaders and professionals offer networking opportunities to changemakers to elevate their social projects. World of Children Awards piloted in New York City in 2011.

Created *The Big Return*, a program piloted in St. Louis, MO, with 20,000 students during the 2011-2012 school year. Partnered with Ashoka's Youth Venture, Cities of Service, St. Louis' Mayor Frances Slay, County Executive Charles Dooley, Build-a-Bear CEO and Founder Maxine Clark, the Lee Institute, Trimeco, Cooperating School Districts, Centene, Character Plus and Blick & Staff to educate and fund young changemakers to launch initiatives to benefit their community and the world. For every dollar RandomKid invested in the St. Louis' youth initiatives, the youth generated a 911% return. The Big Return will be moving into new cities across the USA.
